NEW MANAGER FOR DISCIPLES CENTER AT TAWAKONI



With the reconfiguration of staff that's made necessary by the coming retirement of Regional Minister Renee Bridwell, the Regional Board approved creating the full-time

position of Camp Manager, a role that's been on the camp wish list for ages.

A search team reviewed 10 applicants, interviewed four, and chose Sid Rutland as our best fit. Rutland's background in horse ranching and all the handy skills learned there, his common sense and maturity, and his deep care for the success of the camp stood out.

Rutland's home church is First Christian Church in Independence where his family were very active. His early camping experiences date back to Christian Hills, and he is proud that he never missed an event for which he qualified.

In recent years, he has proven himself in service as an intern, camp counselor, and for the past two years has been the intern supervisor during the summer camp sessions.

Sid brings great experience and useful training for this role: emergency wilderness rescue, medical training toward an EMT certificate, ropes course certification, and water safety certification. He is ready to learn more about the operating functions of the facility.

A new challenge will be marketing to outside entities including family reunions, business clientele, etc. He will be available to bring camp information and programs to your church as well.

KBC GRANT APPLICATIONS DUE

Using only the return on investment on the funds from the sale of property which once housed the Kansas Bible Chair at KU, the KBC Task Force recommends grants for Executive Committee approval, for projects which inform the educational and spiritual growth of Kansas Disciples.

KBC grants subsidize the costs of most regional programs, keeping individual fees much lower than would otherwise be possible. In some cases, individual costs are less than half the actual cost of the programs.

TAWAKONI: THE SECOND DECADE AND BEYOND



On August 21, Mike Carr, CEO of United Camps, Conferences & Retreats (UCCR) visited Disciples Center to bring an outside expert view of the camp and to advise on operations and development.

Consistently, Carr complimented the improvements since CCK purchased the facility in 2004, many of which were done by volunteers with minimal staff involvement. He was pleased to see the obvious care and attention to detail, in maintenance and in cleanliness.

Currently, our challenge is to build Jones Lodge, the much-needed motel-style cabin which will replace cabin 3. Ground-breaking was held at the recent Disciples Connect & Equip (#DCE) on August 10, but the camp committee is reluctant to begin the work until at least ½ of the projected \$350,000 cost is on hand. A \$10,000 challenge match offer stands at more than \$4500 to date; it will expire at the end of 2019.

Overall, Mr. Carr said again and again, "what a wonderful place... for both facilities and as a place to enjoy the natural world."

IN MEMORIAM:

First Christian Church in Independence reports that **Patsy Lyon**, mother of their pastor Mark Lyon, died Monday, August 26. Her service was held in Tulsa in September.

Wesley Charles Ward, 63, died Sept. 16. He had served as pastor at First Christian Church in Girard, as well as at churches in Missouri, California, Pennsylvania, and Oklahoma. Even though Wesley left pastoring churches, he continued to pastor people, helping them through trials in their lives and encouraging young adults to continue their

education past high school. West Side Christian Church in Topeka hosted his funeral service.

Vernon Ball died Sept. 12. Those who attended camp at Christian Hills near Eureka may remember Vernon and his wife Lois, who lived at Christian Hills Camp as caretakers for many years. They continued to live in Eureka after leaving their work at the camp. His service was held at the Christian and Congregational Church in Eureka.
