
Several times a year, congregations receive a special offering to support the ministries of the General Church. These gifts are given above and beyond the regular core support of Disciples Mission Fund.

This service is included in our CDM+ ENGAGE package at no charge, and gives you more flexibility in your giving options. If you're not signed up for ENGAGE, you can create an account by going to https://engage.suran.com/cck and click the bar at the bottom of the page.

Once enrolled you can give through text to the fund of your choice. Text: FUND NAME <dollar amount> to 785-278-0678. For example: ANNUALFUND 100 will make a \$100 donation to the Annual Fund.

A confirmation text should be received. Example: "Reply YES to give \$100 to Annual Fund from your account." Reply YES, if this is correct. A return message will be received: "Submitting your gift ..."

The last message received should be a final confirmation. Example: "Success! Thank you for your gift of \$100. You will receive an email confirming the gift to <your email address>.

With your Engage account you can also update phone and email, register for events and create recurring gifts or one-time gifts all from one login.

THOUGHTS FROM YOUR REGIONAL MINISTER "On the Edge of Control"

I am guessing, with all the cold weather and ice that accompanies these cold days, that most of us have had the scary feeling of being just on the verge of losing control and falling. It is in that moment when we know there's little we can do to stop the inevitable, and

in this minor crisis, we learn again of God's loving presence who will aid us in finding our equilibrium.

Over the last two weeks in February, we have seen the images of the terrible weather devastation. I am amazed, stricken, and shocked at how many have been affected. The loss of heat, and in many places water as well, brings issues of survival to the forefront -- far more than just an inconvenience. Governmental and other helping agencies try their best, but the destruction is far more than any single effort can remedy.

All of this causes me to reflect on the fragility of life. An overabundance of necessities is one thing, yet what we have seen is that this calamity is widespread, affecting people in

DEADLINE APPROACHING FOR KBC AND RECONCILIATION GRANT APPLICATIONS



The Christian Church in Kansas has a variety of grants that are available each year. The deadline for two of those grants – Reconciliation Offering and the Kansas Bible Chair Grants – is fast approaching.

Funds from the Reconciliation Special Day Offering in the Fall provide grants for pro-reconciliation/anti-racism programs. The Reconciliation offering is divided, with one half staying in our region and one half used by General Reconciliation Ministry.

The Kansas Bible Chair (KBC) offers significant funds to provide quality education and spiritual formation for Kansas Disciples. Many events are subsidized by KBC funds, allowing Kansas Disciples to take part at a much lower cost than would otherwise be possible.

These grant requests are reviewed by the grant committee and recommended to the Regional Board for consideration. *The spring submission deadline is March 31*. Grant guidelines are available at www.kansasdisciples.org/grants.

We constantly feel that loss of control, no matter how much we hope for stability. We turn to God for a sense of reassurance that "these falls" will pass and we will find security. The Hebrew scriptures are abundant with passages of assurance: "You are my hiding place and my shield; I hope in your word." And "Hold me up that I may be safe and have regard for your statutes continually." (Ps. 119: 114, 117)

As a society accustomed to many conveniences, even those that bring risk to our environment, we need to reconsider at what cost. We need to listen to scientists who understand the ways we cause harm, and act to prevent additional devastation.

Dear Kansas friends, let us keep our eye on the prize and stay firmly planted in God's love in Jesus Christ, that we may together embrace the challenges of our time. God's love is sufficient, and we will continue to give ourselves to greater faithfulness. May it be so!

On January 2, 1921, Riverside Christian Church began as a Sunday School, meeting in the Riverside

Elementary School. Constitution and bylaws were adopted, officers elected, and lots purchased at the corner of Harrison and Litchfield.

WICHITA'S RIVERSIDE CHRISTIAN CHURCH TURNS 100

Rev. O.N. Roth, who had been the Chancellor, and acting President at Philips University, was called as the first pastor on January 1, 1922. Rev. Roth had also led the South Lawrence Avenue Church of Christ, Wichita, in building their sanctuary. On Sunday, April 29, 1923, eight months after the first shovel of dirt was overturned and more than two years since the first Sunday School, the dedication service for the new building was held. Seventy -six confessions of faith were made that day and enough money was raised to pay off the cost of the building.

Many members and several pastors later, Riverside is still making a difference in the lives of members, the Riverside area, Wichita and beyond. Even though they have not been able to celebrate their birthday in-person, they will be doing so at some time in the months to come.

DCEF President to retire in December



Erick D. 'Rick' Reisinger, President of Disciples Church Extension Fund (DCEF), plans to retire at year's end, December 31.

Throughout his career, Rick has helped DCEF successfully navigate such challenges, including record high interest rates in the late 70s and early 80s; the Dotcom collapse

of the late 90s; the 2007-08 recession and the resulting stock market crash; and, the current pandemic. Under Rick's leadership DCEF remains focused, not on the past, but on the future of its ministry partners.

"It has been my honor to serve congregations, regions, and other ministries and organizations," Rick explains. "I thank current and former staff, board members and churchwide leaders who made this possible, especially during the stressful times of economic crises."

DCE AVAILABLE FOR ASSISTANCE WITH SECOND ROUND PPP APPLICATIONS



The Small Business
Administration (SBA) is now accepting Second Draw
Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan applications through March 31, 2021.
Recipients of the first round of PPP loans that have used the full amount for authorized uses are eligible to

apply. The same general terms apply for this round of lending. The loan amount is based on 2.5 times the average monthly payroll in either 2019 or 2020 and the borrower must be able to show that they had a 25 percent reduction in gross receipts in comparable quarters of 2019 and 2020.

As in the first round of these loans, your current bank is your best first option if they are participating. The following link from the SBA https://www.sba.gov/funding-programs/loans/lender-match will assist you in finding a lender if your bank is not participating:

There is a loan forgiveness component to the Second Draw PPP Loans as follows. Second Draw PPP Loans made to eligible borrowers qualify for full loan forgiveness, if during the 8-to-24-week covered period following loan disbursement:
